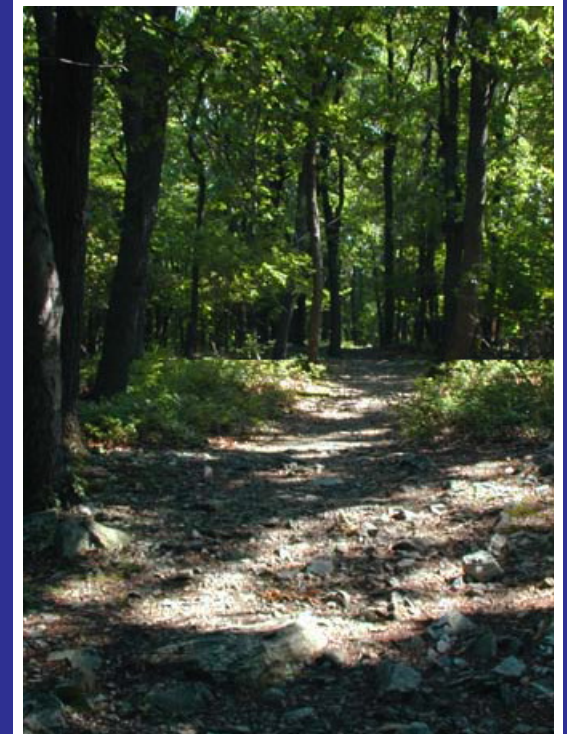

What are the cabins like at Camp Misty Mount?

Historic log cabins built circa 1935 by the WPA with electric lighting (but no outlets). Modern bath houses with great hot water pressure and indoor plumbing. Meals are served family-style in the large indoor dining/dance hall with vegetarian and omnivore options, prepared by campers under the guidance of an experienced chef.

How do you make it so affordable?

It's an all-volunteer weekend. Campers sign up for jobs when they arrive. Two sessions of cooking, dishwashing, floor sweeping, etc. each take an hour or less. This is also a fun part of the weekend with good conversation and sometimes singing!
